



## Acer palmatum 'Garnet'



<b>Výška</b>	3 - 4 m
<b>Šírka</b>	3-4m
<b>Koruna</b>	flat-topped spherical, dark, dense crown, capricious growing
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	smooth, grey-brown
<b>Listy</b>	palmatifid with 5 - 7 deeply dissected leaf segments, dark wine red
<b>Jesenné sfarbenie</b>	Červená
<b>Kvety</b>	red flower corymbs, May
<b>Plody</b>	single seeds, winged, always in pairs, pink
<b>Tŕne</b>	Žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Zvyčajne nie je jedovaté pre ľudí a väčšie zvieratá
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	any, except clay, and not too dry
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Netoleruje spevnené plochy
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	6 (-23,3 do -17,8 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	moderate to poor
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1-6)
<b>Použitie</b>	stromy do nádob, strešné záhrady, malé záhrady, dvory
<b>Tvar</b>	Vysokokmeň, Viackumeň
<b>Pôvod</b>	Gebr. Guldemond, Boskoop, Netherlands, 1959
<b>Synonymum</b>	Acer p. 'Dissectum Garnet'

'Garnet' is probably the most used cultivar of the "Dissectum" group. The plant grows rather more vertically than other cultivars in this group. Eventually, 'Garnet' acquires a virtually round habit. If grafted onto a stem, the branches will hang gracefully. The deep, wine-red colour of the leaves is retained all summer, becoming even redder in autumn. The leaf is relatively large, sometimes more than 10 cm on young twigs, and the leaf segments are less deeply dissected than on other "Dissectum" cultivars. This endows 'Garnet' with a rather less delicate appearance, but it is a strong and vigorously growing cultivar.
