



# Acer pseudoplatanus

## 'Brilliantissimum'



<b>Výška</b>	5 - 7 m, slow growing
<b>Šírka</b>	3-5m
<b>Koruna</b>	round-headed, dark, dense crown
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	bark grey, branches grey to olive-green
<b>Listy</b>	from pink via yellow orange to light green, 12 - 20 cm
<b>Kvety</b>	yellow-green, in pendent racemes, April
<b>Plody</b>	winged nutlets (samara), 3 - 3.5 cm
<b>Tŕne</b>	Žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Má jedovaté časti
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	all soils
<b>Pôdna vlhkosť</b>	Odolné voči krátkodobému zaplaveniu
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Toleruje čiastočné spevnenie
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	4 (-34,4 do -28,9 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	very good
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1-6), Odolné vetru
<b>Stromy pre zvieratá a hmyz</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1-6), Odolné vetru, Cenné pre včely (medonosné)
<b>Použitie</b>	bulváre a široké ulice, pobrežné zóny, priemyselné oblasti, malé záhrady, dvory
<b>Tvar</b>	Vysokokeň
<b>Pôvod</b>	Clark, England, 1905

A small, slow growing shrub with a height to circa 4 m. usually grafted on rootstock and growing into a small tree with a spherical shaped crown, reaching a height of circa 7 m and 5 m across. Because of its striking leaf colour it is an eye-catching tree in spring. The leaf unfurls in spring with a distinctive pink hue and turns into a yellow-orange colour within a few weeks. Later the leaf turns yellow-green and finally light green. The underside of the leaf is always light green. While the leaves unfurl the flowers emerge. The tree is applied in parks. It is also suitable in small gardens. 'Brilliantissimum' does not demand much from the soil. It is tolerant to wet, cold soils and is also wind and sea wind resistant. Bright sunshine may scorch the leaves.
