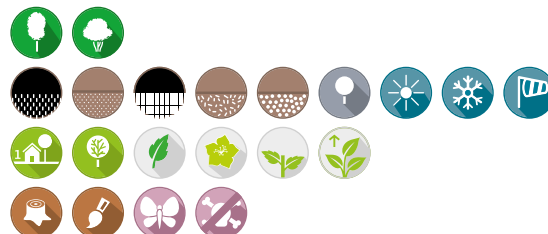




## Betula papyrifera



<b>Výška</b>	18 - 20 (30) m, fast growing
<b>Šírka</b>	10-15m
<b>Koruna</b>	wide, pyramidal to round, half-open crown
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	trunk bright white, later peeling in paper-thin plates
<b>Listy</b>	oval to ovoid, mat green, 5 - 12 cm
<b>Jesenné sfarbenie</b>	Žltá
<b>Kvety</b>	catkins, ? 5 - 7 cm, ? 6 - 8 cm, green yellow, April
<b>Plody</b>	yellow brown fruiting catkins, 3 - 7 cm long
<b>Trne</b>	Žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Zvyčajne nie je jedovaté pre ľudí a väčšie zvieratá
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	sandy, preferably slightly moist
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Netoleruje spevnené plochy
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	3 (-40,0 do -24,5 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	very good
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1-6), Odolné vetru
<b>Stromy pre zvieratá a hmyz</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1-6), Odolné vetru, Cenné pre motýle
<b>Použitie</b>	bulváre a široké ulice, stromy do nádob, strešné záhrady
<b>Tvar</b>	Vysokokmeň, Viackmeň
<b>Pôvod</b>	northern North America, Canada, Alaska

Beautiful birch with a loose crown and slightly pendent branches. Originally growing in the northern parts of the United States and in Canada. Here the tree is an important producer of veneers and pulp. In these regions it attains a height of 30 m and therefore it is considered to belong to the highest of the birches. Can grow into a multiple-stemmed tree with wide spreading branches that are slightly pendent. Often has a variable crown. Width circa 12 m. The bark is bright white and peels in paper-thin plates. Under the plates the bark is darker. Twigs are shiny red brown and display many warty lenticels. The leaf is dull green and the underside is a lighter green. The leaf margin is coarsely toothed. Prefers slightly moist soil, dry soil gives much dead wood. Shallow rooting.
