



## Zelkova serrata 'Village Green'



<b>Výška</b>	10 - 12 m
<b>Šírka</b>	10-12m
<b>Koruna</b>	vase-shaped, half-open crown
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	grey, slightly flaking trunk with orange-brown bast
<b>Listy</b>	ovoid to elongated, top tapered, soft green, 7 - 13 cm
<b>Jesenné sfarbenie</b>	Žltá, Oranžová, Červená
<b>Kvety</b>	unremarkable, unisexual, monoecious, green, April/May
<b>Plody</b>	small bean-like fruit, 0.4 – 0.5 cm
<b>Tréne</b>	Žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Zvyčajne nie je jedovaté pre ľudí a väčšie zvieratá
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	humus, moist, loamy
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Toleruje spevnenie
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	6a (-23,3 do -20,6 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	moderate
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1–6)
<b>Použitie</b>	bulváre a široké ulice, stromy do nádob
<b>Tvar</b>	Vysokokmeň, Viackmeň
<b>Pôvod</b>	Princeton Nurseries, Allentown, New Jersey, USA, before 1964

American selection that grows more quickly at first than the species does, but later growth slows down. The crown of 'Village Green' remains lower and narrower than that of the species, approx.10 - 12 m, with a width of 5 - 6 m. The grey bark is smooth at first, with pink to brownish orange lenticels, flaking off later to reveal the orange-brown bast underneath. The ovoid to elongated leaves are soft green and turn a bronzy red and orange-yellow in the autumn. The leaves are lighter green on the underside. The top is long and tapers to a point and the leaf edge has single teeth tapering to a point. 'Village Green' is unsusceptible to Dutch elm's disease. Due to its slower growth and narrower crown, this cultivar is better suited than the species for streets and avenues.
