



## Cupressus sempervirens 'Stricta'



<b>Výška</b>	10-12 m
<b>Šírka</b>	1,5-2m
<b>Koruna</b>	columnar, dark, dense crown
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	grey
<b>Listy</b>	green, evergreen
<b>Kvety</b>	yellowgreen, flowers in March
<b>Plody</b>	brown
<b>Tŕne</b>	žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Zvyčajne nie je jedovaté pre ľudí a väčšie zvieratá
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	clay soil, loamy soil, sandy soil, peaty soil
<b>Pôdna vlhkosť</b>	Vhodné do suchých pôd
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Toleruje čiastočné spevnenie
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	8a (-12,2 do -9,5 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	good, tolerates sea wind but not cold, drying wind
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné vetru
<b>Použitie</b>	bulváre a široké ulice, úzke ulice, pobrežné zóny, priemyselné oblasti, dvory
<b>Tvar</b>	Vyvetvený ihličnan, Vzorový ihličnan

Cupressus sempervirens 'Stricta' is a particularly characteristic conifer that has become world-famous thanks to photographs and paintings of Italian landscapes. Its tight, dense columnar shape is unmistakable. It is a columnar tree 20 to 30 m tall. The scaly foliage is deep, dull dark green. Formerly known as f. stricta, the columnar C. sempervirens has now been elevated to cultivar level. This makes it possible to grow species-specific columnar trees, with C. sempervirens being naturally variable as a species.
