



## Ginkgo biloba 'Saratoga'



<b>Výška</b>	15 - 20 m
<b>Šírka</b>	8-10m
<b>Koruna</b>	broad pyramidal, light, open crown, capricious growing
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	twigs light brown, bark grey-brown, later deeply grooved
<b>Listy</b>	in clusters of 3 - 5, variable, narrow fan-shaped and very deeply dissected, about 10 cm long, green
<b>Jesenné sfarbenie</b>	Žltá
<b>Kvety</b>	green, inconspicuous, April/May
<b>Plody</b>	none; male cultivar, fruitless cultivar
<b>Tŕne</b>	Žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Zvyčajne nie je jedovaté pre ľudí a väčšie zvieratá
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	any
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Toleruje spevnenie
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	5a (-28,8 do -26,1 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	fairly to good
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1–6), Odolné vetru
<b>Použitie</b>	bulváre a široké ulice, stromy do nádob, strešné záhrady, priemyselné oblasti
<b>Tvar</b>	Vysokokmeň, Vetvený, Viackmeň, Vyvetvený ihličnan, Vzorový ihličnan
<b>Pôvod</b>	Saratoga Horticultural Foundation, CA, USA, 1976

An American selection that initially has a narrow manner of growth. The crown ultimately takes on a pyramidal shape, but it grows slowly, particularly when young. Height 15 - 20 m, width approx. 10 m. The fan-shaped leaves and flower buds are on short shoots. The shape of the leaves of 'Saratoga' varies, but is always very deeply incised. The leaves grow in bundles of 3 - 5 and turn golden yellow in the autumn, although less spectacular than other cultivars. 'Saratoga' is a male type that is excellently suited as a street and avenue tree, thanks to its lack of fruit. Requires a site with ample light. Winter hardiness zone: 5a
