



## Pinus sylvestris 'Glaucia'



<b>Výška</b>	12 m
<b>Šírka</b>	5-8m
<b>Koruna</b>	round, dark, dense crown, capricious growing
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	twigs orange-brown, bark grey-brown, peeling in rough strips
<b>Listy</b>	stiff needles, slightly twisted, in twos, 4 - 6 cm, intense grey-blue, evergreen
<b>Kvety</b>	? in clusters by the young shoots, light lemon-yellow, fragrant flowers
<b>Plody</b>	pendent cones, 1 - 5 together, 3 - 7 cm long, 2 - 3 cm wide
<b>Trúne</b>	Žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Zvyčajne nie je jedovaté pre ľudí a väčšie zvieratá
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	well-drained, quite dry soils, lightly acidic
<b>Pôdna vlhkosť</b>	Vhodné do suchých pôd
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Netoleruje spevnené plochy
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	2 (-45,5 do -40,1 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	good, also tolerates sea wind
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1–6), Odolné vetru
<b>Stromy pre zvieratá a hmyz</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1–6), Odolné vetru, Plody ako potrava pre vtáctvo
<b>Použitie</b>	stromy do nádob, strešné záhrady, pobrežné zóny, priemyselné oblasti
<b>Tvar</b>	Vysokokmeň, Viackmeň, Vyvetvený ihličnan, Vzorový ihličnan
<b>Pôvod</b>	Germany, circa 1990

Spherical tree which may grow rather slowly when young but can eventually reach around 12 m. The twigs are strikingly orange-brown. The mature bark is grey-brown and peels off in rough strips. The stiff, rather short needles have a slight twist and are 4 to 6 cm long. They are in twos and intense grey-blue. The grey-brown cones hang alone or in clusters of 2 to 5. This Pinus even grows in extreme conditions although it prefers well-drained, lightly acidic, quite dry soils. Very resistant to (sea) wind and not sensitive to air pollution. The cultivar name, 'Glaucia' was given to it after 1 January 1959 and is not valid according to the nomenclature rules. This takes nothing away from the fact that it is a fine tree.
