



## Acer capillipes



<b>Výška</b>	5 - 8 (12) m
<b>Šírka</b>	4-5m
<b>Koruna</b>	vase shaped, half open; as a shrub with overhanging branches, light, open crown, capricious growing
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	conspicuously grey-white striped
<b>Listy</b>	3/5 lobes, green, 6 - 12 cm long
<b>Jesenné sfarbenie</b>	Oranžová, Červená
<b>Kvety</b>	6 - 12 cm long racemes, green-white, May
<b>Plody</b>	single-seeded, winged, always in pairs
<b>Tríne</b>	Žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Zvyčajne nie je jedovaté pre ľudí a väčšie zvieratá
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	lightly acid soil
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Netoleruje spevnené plochy
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	6a (-23,3 do -20,6 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	moderate
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1–6)

Very beautiful small tree with the striking feature of the conspicuously grey-white striped bark. This is best visible when juvenile. When the trunk grows thicker this remarkable feature fades gradually. The young twigs are of a shiny red. The dark green leaves have three pointed lobes. In autumn they turn from orange-red to deep red. The flowers grow in long, pendent racemes, the winged seeds turn from light green to red-brown. A. capillipes has a half open, wide, vase shaped crown. The plant does not like a very windy site. A. capillipes likes a lightly acid soil. The plant roots shallow with a strongly branching root system. This tree of Japanese origin was imported to the west by Charles Sargent in 1892. A. capillipes is best used as a solitary in gardens and parks.
