



## Fagus sylvatica 'Remillyensis'



<b>Výška</b>	3 - 5 m (depending on graft height)
<b>Šírka</b>	6-8m
<b>Koruna</b>	broad, weeping, dark, dense crown, capricious growing
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	smooth, grey bark, soft
<b>Listy</b>	oval to ovate, glossy green, 4 - 10 cm long
<b>Jesenné sfarbenie</b>	Žltá
<b>Kvety</b>	small, inconspicuous flower catkins, May
<b>Plody</b>	nuts, in cupules covered with brushy spines, 1 - 2 cm
<b>Tŕne</b>	Žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Zvyčajne nie je jedovaté pre ľudí a väčšie zvieratá
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	well drained, humic soil, not too wet
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Netoleruje spevnené plochy
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	5b (-26,0 do -23,4 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	moderate
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1-6)
<b>Použitie</b>	malé záhrady, dvory
<b>Pôvod</b>	Remilly, France, circa 1820

A rarity that catches the eye because of its peculiar habit. 'Remillyensis' has an umbrella-like habit with twisted branches. The limbs droop, so that a weeping look is generated. The eventual height depends on the height of the graft union. It is a seldom grown cultivar. The leaf is shiny green and turns to yellow brown in autumn. The inflorescence is inconspicuous and is followed by small nutlets. This cultivar is used as a solitary in small gardens and parks. 'Remillyensis' prefers calcareous, moisture-retentive but well-drained soil that is high in humus content. The tree is intolerant to hard surfaces and a high water table. Winter hardiness zone: 5b
