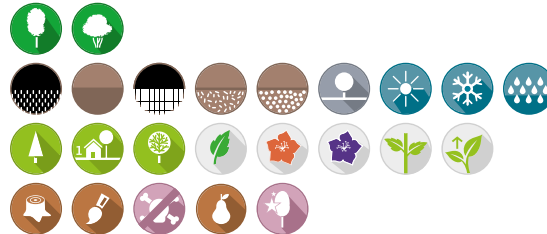




## Liquidambar styraciflua 'Stared'



<b>Výška</b>	15 - 20 m
<b>Šírka</b>	5-7m
<b>Koruna</b>	narrow pyramidal to pyramidal, dark, dense crown
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	Dark grey, grooved, hardly any corky fissures on branches and twigs
<b>Listy</b>	Palmately lobed, 7 lobes or splits, glossy green, 8 - 16 cm long
<b>Jesenné sfarbenie</b>	Žltá, Oranžová, Červená, Fialová
<b>Kvety</b>	purplish red, fairly inconspicuous, April/May
<b>Plody</b>	round, spiky capsule, almost stemless or on short stem
<b>Tríne</b>	Žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Zvyčajne nie je jedovaté pre ľudí a väčšie zvieratá
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	fertile, loamy soil
<b>Pôdna vlhkosť</b>	Vhodné do vlhkých pôd
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Toleruje spevnenie
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	5b (-26,0 do -23,4 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	moderate
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1–6)
<b>Použitie</b>	bulváre a široké ulice
<b>Tvar</b>	Vysokokmeň, Viackmeň
<b>Synonymum</b>	Liquidambar styraciflua 'Stella'

Large tree with a narrow pyramidal crown, up to approx. 20 m. Densely branching, even when mature. The grey bark has shallow grooves. The young twigs are light green and have hardly any corky fissures. The leaf is conspicuously star-shaped. This is reinforced by the lobes also having dissected margins, giving the leaf a double-lobed appearance. It turns orange, red, or purplish red, often with yellowish hues. The flowers are fairly inconspicuous and, unlike many other Liquidambar cultivars, purplish red. They are followed by round, spiky capsules that persist in the winter. Good park, avenue or street tree. Prefers fertile, moist soil; cannot tolerate persisting drought.
