



## Sorbus hybrida 'Gibbsii'



<b>Výška</b>	5 - 7 m
<b>Šírka</b>	3-4m
<b>Koruna</b>	round, dark, dense crown
<b>Kôra a vetvy</b>	smooth grey bark, twigs glossy olive-green
<b>Listy</b>	ovoid, bottom half deeply incised, dark green, 8 - 15 cm
<b>Kvety</b>	white, in umbels with felt-like hairs, Ø 10 cm, May
<b>Plody</b>	red, spherical, up to 1.5 cm Ø
<b>Tŕne</b>	žiadny
<b>Jedovatosť</b>	Zvyčajne nie je jedovaté pre ľudí a väčšie zvieratá
<b>Typ pôdy</b>	makes few demands, can grow on poor soils
<b>Pôdna vlhkosť</b>	Vhodné do suchých pôd
<b>Spevnené plochy</b>	Toleruje čiastočné spevnenie
<b>Zóna odolnosti</b>	5a (-28,8 do -26,1 °C)
<b>Odolnosť voči vetru</b>	good
<b>Ostatná odolnosť</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1–6), Odolné vetru
<b>Stromy pre zvieratá a hmyz</b>	Odolné mrazu (WH 1–6), Odolné vetru, Plody ako potrava pre vtáctvo
<b>Použitie</b>	bulváre a široké ulice, stromy do nádob, strešné záhrady

<b>Pôvod</b>	Gibbs, Aldenham, England, 1924

In comparison to the species 'Gibbsii' has branches that ascend at an angle, eventually causing a dense spherical crown to form. The smooth grey trunk is somewhat grooved at the base and the olive-green twigs bear lenticels. Older twigs turn a chocolate brown. The bottom half of the ovoid leaves is pinnate with 2 - 4 pairs of leaflets, while the upper half is lobed. The upper side of the leaves is matt dark green; the underside is greyish-white with hairs. The abundant white flowers emerge in May in umbels measuring approx. 10 cm. The remarkably large fruits emerge from August onwards; they turn from green to coral red. They remain in the tree for a long time. 'Gibbsii' is a vigorous grower and is practically insensitive to bacterial fire blight. Is reasonably resistant to hard surfaces.
